The “House of the Wannsee Conference” Memorial and Education Site was established by a decision of the Berlin Senate (Document 12/236) because at that time there was not yet a central memorial site dedicated to the victims of the holocaust.

The memorial site is financed by “Erinnern für die Zukunft - Trägerverein des Hauses der Wannsee-Konferenz e.V” (Remembering for the Future - Governing Body of the House of the Wannsee Conference Association), a non-profit organisation with funding from the Federal State of Berlin and the Federal Republic of Germany.

The stated aim of Remembering for the Future - Governing Body of the House of the Wannsee Conference Association (registered with the Berlin District Court, reg. no. VR 10493 Nz), established in 1990, is to promote:

- remembrance of the victims of the National Socialist policy of genocide,
- the provision of information on the National Socialist crimes,
- education in democracy and the defence of human rights.
