Joseph Wulf Library

The library is named after the historian [Joseph Wulf \(1912-1974\)](#), who unsuccessfully attempted to establish a Documentation Centre on National socialism in the Wannsee-Villa in the 1960's.

Our collection covers the following main topics: History of the Jewish people in Europe; anti-Semitism; national-socialism; persecution and annihilation under the NS regime; racism; neonazism; culture of remembrance and coming to terms with NS past after 1945. A large proportion of the collection is in a language other than German.

Collections

The library has over 65,000 volumes and [120 current journal subscriptions](#). It also offers access to subject-specific [e-books](#) and [databases](#).

In addition, we have a collection of more than 10.000 films (documentaries as well as fiction films) and a range of newspapers and governmental records on microfilm and -fiche.

Information for library users

The Joseph Wulf Mediothek is a reference library. The printed books are [systematically organized](#) and mainly accessible on open shelves.
