

Particularities of the museum work under the conditions of the full-scale Russian invasion

Discussion via Zoom: Wednesday, March 8, 2023 1 p.m. Berlin, 2 p.m. Kyiv

Since the early days of the full-scale Russian invasion of Ukraine, the **National Museum of the History of Ukraine in the Second World War** has been documenting this war and highlighting it in its projects. These activities resulted in number of domestic and international exhibitions, in particular "Ukraine – Crucifixion". Presented in Kyiv on May 8, 2022, it is the world's first temporary exhibition on the full-scale Russian-Ukrainian war, the unique project on the war prepared during the same war.

Alla Hrushetska, the Museum's tour guide and former participant of the seminars at the House of the Wannsee Conference in Berlin, will speak about the activities of the Museum in wartime and her own experience of working under these conditions. The particular focus will be made on the communication with the visitors, many of whom have been affected by the brutal Russian aggression.
